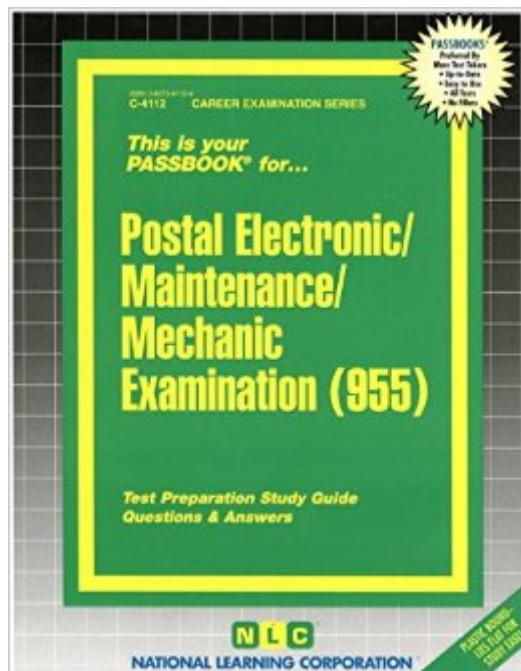

Buying the book is worth it. A few of the questions were on the test. FEW EXAMPLES :What is the effective value of voltage? Boolean truth table was on the exam. Questions about fulcrums, relief valves. I studied EET in college. Also, studied Aircraft Maintenance. So to give it a shot I decided to buy the book. The book is so extensive. As a backup I went to the library and borrowed the old exam study book for the 931. That book actually had a few questions in it as well. Since the books are so big and you only have about a week to study after applying to the USPS, I first copied the list of letter answers in the back of each section then reviewed the questions. After reading the question, I looked at the answer. This saved me a lot of time. I reviewed both books in less than a week. I spent an extensive amount of time on the spatial section. Studying for hours at a time. The exam contains welding, like whats the first weld called? Why do you braze and blaze? Why do you

preheat the metal ?Also on the exam were electrical engineering questions concerning inductance, capacitance, shunts, short circuited transformer to work on it. My advice.. if your not applying for the electrical tech position, don't study that part in the book. You will not understand it neither will you pass it on the test so you will be wasting valuable time studying electrical engineering out of this book. The book actually help me with some of the questions on the exam even though the questions that were in the book was not on the test but the language and terms were helpful. Studying and along with Prayer...I passed by The Blood of Jesus with a 74. Hallelujah!!!

I am a postal employee for 29 years and I made a 99.9 on the test back then. I had friends that purchased the book and made a perfect 100. I have purchased this book for several of my friends that passed the test and work at the postal service. I am a true believer in the book because it really show u the process of learning to study and pass the postal exam, not to mention all the extras that come with the book for such a reasonable price. I purchased this book for my husband who took exam 955 and with only a week with this book, he was able to get an 87% score on one of the segments. I went through the material with him and some of the sections can be difficult, but with time and effort this book will help you pass the exam 955.

I think this book not only helpful for those who trying to get the job but also for building maintenance mechanics in general. The book cover overall knowledge and situation that you may run into when things break down in the building. The book show me how I need to be aware on anything that I would touch as a maintenance mechanic. Not only the technology in general, the book also show you how you also need to understand and aware of mechanic parts. How you need to identify them, pick the right shape and sizes in general. Pretty much the book give you the suggestions and point out to you the topics (meter, reader, racks, parts,...), and you need to go into the details your self. Again, don't take the book for granted. If you totally new to trades in general, this is not for you. But if you serious about getting the postal job and improving your overall industrial building maintenance skills. This thing worth it, I hope this helps.

I have no electrical or mechanical background, but this book is somewhat helpful. As far as the

material goes, I wish that the answers were given in more detail. I am disappointed on how the book was put together. I realize that is only the distributor, but I have pages that are duplicated, page numbers out of sequence, and pages that are upside down. It was very frustrating. UPDATE: Jan. 2015 I used this book and other source material to study for the test that I just took this month. I qualified for the Maintenance Mechanic (MM), Maintenance Mechanic (MPE) and also qualified for Building Maintenance (BEM). My scores were in the low 70's, but I at least qualified in those fields.

I bought this book for the Cleveland, Ohio postal 955 test in jan, 2014, and it was almost no help at all. The book covers soooooo much unnecessary areas that are not on the test. The book and test did cover alot of spatial relations, multiple shapes put together to form another shape, and paper cut-outs to form shapes. 1st. test was 60 questions in 60 min. the 2nd. test was 60 questions in 40 min. Do not waste time on the 2nd test. My highest grade was 88.

Most of the easier tool-related questions in the book weren't on the test when I took it in May 2016. The tougher questions, especially relating to motors and electronics were helpful though, as is some of the spatial stuff. All in all, there was a lot of material I didn't find relevant but this book got me through the test.

There is nothing in this book that is on the test. It was absolutely no help whatsoever. It doesn't show how to do any problems. It's just tests and answer keys and those have nothing to do with the test.

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
