

While I knew the importance of writers' workshop, morning message, mini-lessons and genre awareness, including these in my daily lesson plans was a monumental task. This resource gave me actual samples of all of these as well as suggestions for literature to use with the lessons. These activities teach or allow practice for very basic writing skills. They are easily integrated into the day and pay off through repetition and practice. I would recommend it for young learners, under grade 3 (may be too elementary for grade 2 in some instances...depends on the level of the learners). I use it with language learners grades K-2.
