A third book club selection of mine was "Jon Bonnell's TEXAS Favorites", and where my two previous reviews spoke to the love and comfort the authors were trying to convey with their efforts, this is one big "Ft. Worth Fancy" Cookbook. While some of the recipes herein are to be found anywhere, there are several I consider unique to "upscale" Texas cuisine, particularly those dealing with local game animals and our Gulf Coast Seafood. The photography is outstanding and makes you want to try the dish just because it looks so darn appetizing. There are frequent side notes regarding Bonnell's presentations and they provide a good background for his interpretation of the recipe itself. Being a fifth generation Texan, I'm proud of my heritage and partial to things dealing with it, so I might be a bit biased; but all things considered, this seems a book that will get some use around the house when entertaining as well as when I'm searching out how to put some local color or flavor into a more common dish. I like it, and give it a strong "Thumbs Up."
